JOB TITLE:	Community Football Coach (Girls' & Women's)
SALARY:	£12,000 (pro-rata)
HOURS:	37 hours per week (subject to some weekly fluctuations). Hours will include weekend and evening work

DURATION OF EMPLOYMENT	This post is a fixed term contract of 10 months from Post's start date.
GEOGRAPHICAL AREA:	The coaching work will be based across the 2 School Sports Partnerships in Plymouth (Plymstock and Sir John Hunt).

JOB PURPOSE:	To plan, coach and monitor a co-ordinated programme of high quality professional coaching as detailed within the Devon FA's development strategy for women and girls football. The main focus will be on delivering the FA school club link work. This will involve supporting the local Charter Standard clubs within Plymouth, the local Girls League, and the Girls Centre of Excellence.
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DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Deliver (and monitor) high quality football coaching sessions to Girls' within schools and clubs, covering all levels of the Long Term Player Development model but focusing mainly on: FUNdamentals and learn to train.
2. Help deliver the Devon County FA Football Development Plan written in-line with the FA's National Game Strategy.
3. Work with FA Charter Standard clubs and School Sports Coordinators to create and nurture quality sustainable school club links throughout the county.
4. Interact with the volunteer workforce network, and provide guidance and support where appropriate.

5. Assist with the development and delivery of girls football in schools based in the 2 School Sports Partnerships in Plymouth.
6. Support the identification of talent by promoting opportunities with local FA Centres of Excellence and county/school squads.
7. Support the training and mentoring of new and existing young leaders to volunteer with 5-11yr olds in clubs and school activities.
8. Deliver targeted coaching programmes that help to address under representation in women & girls football.
9. Support the Devon, Junior and Minor League to increase its membership base, of female players and teams.
10. Coach curricular and extracurricular activities within mainstream primary and special schools within the Plymouth boundaries.
11. To liaise with the women and girls football development officer to ensure accurate monitoring data is collected and reported quarterly.
12. To have a personal commitment to keep abreast of the latest relevant training and qualifications.
13. Organise and deliver holiday girls football coaching camps, at selected locations throughout Plymouth.
14. To be an advocate for best practise in the county and to promote the messages of the Devon County Football Association and Football Association.
15. Undertake such other relevant duties, which, from time to time, may be required by the Devon County Football Association.
16. Carry out all duties with regard to relevant legislation, and Devon County Football Associations and Football Associations policies and procedures.
17. Provide administration support for the County FA's Girls Centre of Excellence.
